# Learning goals in e-Learning



## What are learning goals?

Clear statements of what learner will be able to do after completing a course. They describe the results of learning (skill, knowledge) and act as the starting point in backward design.

## Why are they important?

- Guide content and activity selection
- Help choose appropriate assessments methods
- Show learners the purpose of the course and requirements
- Increase motivation of participants

## How to write a good learning goal?

### DO:

- Focus on learner action
- Use clear, actionable verbs

### DON'T:

- Use vague verbs
- Create too many goals

## Team tips:

- Always start course design with learning goals
- State clear goals, so it will be easier to justify your design process
- Use the checklist for guidance



## CHECKLIST: is your learning goal well-written?

- ☐ Does it describe what the learner will accomplish?
- ☐ Does it use a clear action verb?
- ☐ Does it match the expected skill/knowledge level?
- ☐ Does it avoid vague verbs?
- ☐ Would it be clear to someone outside the project?
